One of the best gift ideas for boaters is to sign them up for a boating safety course. Knowledge is power, and it has been statistically shown that boaters who have taken a safety class are far less likely to be involved in a boating mishap or fatality. Course topics include basic boat handling, required and recommended safety equipment, navigational rules and dealing with boating emergencies. One of the most valuable gifts for boaters doesn't cost anything but time - a free vessel safety check (VSC) with the local Coast Guard Auxiliary. An Auxiliarist will examine your vessel to ensure compliance with federal, state and local safety requirements before getting underway. Ten other great gift ideas to help keep boaters safe include:

- Sleek, lightweight, and comfortable inflatable life jackets (personal flotation devices PFDs)
- A carbon monoxide detector
- Emergency signaling kits -- flares, signal mirror, whistle, etc.
- Kill switch leash -- kills the engine if the boater falls overboard
- Up-to-date navigational charts and/or a handheld GPS unit
- Navigation tools and calculators
- Hand-held VHF marine radio with extra batteries
- Personal emergency position indicating radio beacons (PEPIRBs)
- Tool kit and spare parts for boats
- First Aid kit, sunscreen, sunglasses, food and water

The price range for these items runs from under \$10, up to several hundred dollars, but giving the gift of safety to a friend or loved one is priceless.

The Coast Guard and Coast Guard Auxiliary recommend these gifts in the effort to save lives and reduce mishaps on America's waterways.

# **Clean Boating Tips**

#### **Contain Trash**

- Do not let trash get thrown or blown overboard.
- If trash blows overboard, retrieve it.

#### Recycle

- Recycle cans, glass, plastic, newspaper, antifreeze, oil, and lead batteries.
- Bring used monofilament fishing line to recycling bins at your marina or tackle shop.

#### **Fuel Cautiously**

- Remember, fuel expands as it warms up.
- Fill your tank just before leaving on a trip.

#### **Control Oil in the Bilge**

- Place an oil absorbent pad under the engine.
- Secure fuel hoses to prevent chafing and leaks.

## **Properly Dispose of Oil Absorbent Materials**

- If the pad is saturated with gas, allow it to air dry. Reuse.
- Bio-remediating bilge booms should not be put in plastic bags. Discard in regular trash.

#### Clean Gently

- Wash your boat frequently with a sponge and plain water.
- Use detergents sparingly.

#### Maintain Your Vessel Wisely

- Collect all paint chips, dust, and residue. Dispose in regular trash.
- Share leftover paint and varnish.

#### Sewage

- Never discharge raw sewage in U.S. territorial waters.
- Use restrooms on shore.

#### **Dispose of Fish Waste Properly**

- Do not throw fish waste into marina waters.
- Discard waste over deep water or in the trash.

#### **Protect Sensitive Habitat**

- Proceed slowly in shallow areas.
- Do not disturb wildlife.

## Be a Responsible Boater

- Learn about environmentally safe products and practices.
- Obey laws governing speeding, littering, and discharge.
